

## Slowing Down

The great temptation for Jesus at the beginning of his ministry was to HURRY. Turn these stones to bread, jump off of the high cliff, become a great political ruler. In other words, hurry up, get to the point. Don't waste time with careful and thoughtful planning for ministry. Let's get the Jesus Traveling Church of Miracles and Wonders on the road!

Remember, every temptation brought before Jesus in the desert by Satan is something that Jesus eventually did. He fed hungry people. He performed amazing acts. He had a tremendous influence over the politics of the day. The temptation he faced was the one to hurry up and get on with it.

Maybe one of the greatest temptations we face in the life of faith is similar: the desire to hurry up, to speed up, to get going without time for quiet.

I have been doing a lot of reading these days on revitalizing the church. There is a common theme among all of them. Revitalization occurs when we slow down and invite the Spirit of God to be in our midst.

What we are trying to give ourselves by slowing down is the opportunity to experience the holy, to experience something sacred. This takes time. John Ortberg says that "the great danger we face is not that we will renounce our faith but settle for a mediocre version of it." Sometimes we settle, as one writer claims, for a type of spiritual minimum wage.

If you read the Ten Commandments you will notice that the big sins get very little attention; just a few words. "You shall not murder. You shall not steal. You shall not commit adultery." Pretty clear; not much commentary needed.

However, the commandment on rest takes four verses to explain!

*"Remember the Sabbath Day and keep it holy. Six days you shall labor and do all your work. But the seventh day is a Sabbath...you shall not do any work...For in six days the Lord made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that is in them, but rested the seventh day; therefore the Lord blessed the Sabbath day and consecrated it."*

The word for sabbath, shabat, means more than rest, it implies an opportunity to refocus, recharge, and reenergize.

Jesus invites us to go away to a quiet place. Where is that for you? It may be no further than your back yard or your living room or the library here at the church or wherever. We need to be saved from the ruthlessness of hurry so that we might live the uncluttered and holy life that God invites us toward.

## Six Degrees of Connection

Back in January, when winter still had its long frozen fingers firmly wrapped around the metro and the streets were coated with a nearly invisible but oh-so-dangerous sheen of icy glaze, I had the misfortune to find myself careening uncontrollably down a hill in front of my daughter's school. Unbelievably, I gained control, but mere seconds after I thought I'd averted the worst, I was slammed into from behind by another car.

Fortunately neither I nor the other driver were injured, and he was kind and concerned about my well-being and my car. "You look familiar," he said to me. "I think we work out at the same YMCA."

The next week at work, as the staff reviewed a list of recent visitors, a name jumped out. The man from the accident had attended worship. A few weeks later, a familiar face sat next to me at the children's musical. Same guy from the accident, watching his son perform alongside my daughter. Since then, I've seen him at the Y several times.

These chance encounters made me think about six degrees of separation, the theory that everyone in the world might be connected, in six steps or less, via "a friend of a friend," to anyone else in the world.

In a congregation of more than 3,000 members, how many degrees of connections might we as a church have here in the metropolitan area? What if each of us made an effort to tell one person something amazing about our church every week? Whether with friends and family, or with people we meet in passing, the connections we make and stories we share have influence. Word of mouth marketing is probably the most important external communication tool we possess here at the church. All the paid advertising and promotion in the world is no match for a personal story from an acquaintance.

In a year where our ability to promote our church externally has been hindered by tight budgets, I encourage you to use your connections to tell our church's stories. Maybe this week you tell someone about the lives touched by our mission team in Nicaragua or by the money we raised for Haiti relief. Next week perhaps it's something intriguing you heard Glen say in worship. Maybe next you describe our Youth Ministry's unique partnership with the Kansas City Urban Youth Center.

You can help us communicate Country Club Christian Church's message of grace, hope and justice. Share your church stories with the next person you run into.

## Looking Down the Line

My colleague Mike Graves (who will preach here this summer) has written an essay that reminds me of how we often shift from greed and anxiety to generosity and love freely offered. Mike borrowed the image from the Food Resource Bank.

The Food Resource Bank invites us to picture every single person in the world lined up in order of our economic status. The richest person in the world stands at one end of the line and the poorest person in the world stands at the other end. Imagine what each single person looks like. What

are they each wearing? What is the expression on the face of each individual? Note the wrinkles on the faces of the elderly and the brightness in the eyes of the toddlers.

Now place yourself in the line. We all belong there someplace in the line. No matter what position we occupy in the line, we all have a tendency to look in the same direction – towards the person wealthier than us. But when each of us turns our gaze in the opposite direction, and looks instead upon those who have less, our hearts shift. We become gracious and generous and eager to share our bounty with our brothers and sisters around the world.

Just before I left for Nicaragua, I stopped on the Plaza to purchase some new khaki pants and a cotton top for the airplane ride. (Nothing in my closet seemed to work for a flight that departed in 10 degree weather and arrived in 90 degree weather.) As I shopped, my gaze was fixed on those ahead of me in the line. But when I got off the plane the next day in Nicaragua, all I could see was those at the other end of the line. Then I felt within my own soul, the deep desire to love, to serve, to give.
