Mary practiced bank regulatory law for the federal government in Washington, D.C. and Kansas City for 14 years until resigning to enjoy full-time parenting. Mary first joined the church around 1986, and again in 2007, after living three years in Michigan. In the past, she has served as Secretary of the Elders (1996-1997) and Chair of the Elders (1999-2000). She was one of the co-chairs of last year's church rummage sale and has been a past member of various councils and committees, including Education, Youth, Future Focus, Singles, the Planning Committee for the Sunday evening service, and Disciple Bible Study. ## One Life. Six Words. What's Yours?

Legend has it that Earnest Hemingway was once challenged to write an entire story in six words. He came back with "For sale: baby shoes, never worn." He claimed it was his best work. The Hemingway legend prompted *SMITH Magazine*, an on-line magazine devoted to telling stories, to challenge their readers to write their life stories in six words. More than 15,000 did, and 832 of these life stories are in a book entitled, *Not Quite What I Was Planning: Six-Word Memoirs by*

*Writers Famous & Obscure*. The book is very difficult to put down!

And so I wondered, what would my life story be if I had to tell it in six words? Now, I'm a preacher, and so let's be honest – I'm never short on words. Heck, I can't even order coffee in less than six words! Still, I decided to give it a shot. I have a whole page filled with my efforts, but I'll spare you all but these six:

Every report card: "Conduct needs improvement."

Knew better, but did it anyway.

Took road less traveled. Stubbed toe.

Plays well with others. Almost always.

Boy, that was fun. What's next?

God knows me. Loves me anyway.

Part of being a person of faith is seeking the courage to, as Frederick Buechner says, "ask one way or another, what it means to be ourselves." When we attempt to do the hard work of the soul, we often discover our true selves.

So allow me to challenge you to try something that may actually turn out to be fun. I challenge you to write your entire life story in six words. Be original – no cheating by using six words straight from a quote or song, no matter how well they sum up your life.

The truth is, we all have a past – families we come from, things we've done, mistakes we've made, joys we've experienced. Where we've been and what we've done has shaped us into who we are today! We have to embrace our story. We don't have to be proud of it, but we must claim it, because it's our own.

May we discover within the spiritual courage to embrace who we are and who God is calling us to be.

## Do You Think You're a "Former" Deacon?

When a person is elected as a deacon for the first time, he or she serves an initial three-year term and is then given an opportunity to take a year off from service, if desired. The deacon thus becomes "inactive," but remains a deacon. There is no such thing as a "former" deacon unless someone quits or resigns! Each spring, as part of the nominating process, inactive deacons and deacons who are finishing their three-year term are sent a letter inviting them to "re-up" for another term, i.e., to serve communion both during the worship service and to our homebound members.

Because deacons have a choice as to what years they serve, it means there are several lists of deacons, i.e., those whose initial term is concluding, those who have been inactive one year, inactive two years, three years, etc. Sometimes (and VERY inadvertently) not all inactive deacons receive the letter inviting them to re-up for another three-year term. If you have EVER been elected as a deacon and have not received a letter inviting you to another term of service, please know the church invites and welcomes you to become active again! It's very easy – simply call or email Jane Fletcher (janef@cccckc.org or 816-333-4917) and let her know you'd like to become an active deacon!

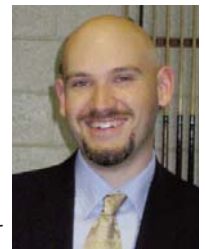
**July 18 – Nationally** – Congressman Emanuel Cleaver, II will speak about service on the national scale.

## Rebuilding the Walls

“Rebuilding the Walls.” This phrase, which I developed after reading the first two chapters of Nehemiah, has echoed in my brain over the past months and weeks because it’s the theme for CYF’s upcoming mission trip to Chicago. It’s nothing extraordinary or snazzy (I must admit I wasn’t born for a career in advertising!) but I think it summarizes the primary theme of the book of Nehemiah and what I hope we will do amongst the homeless of the Windy City.

As you might remember, the narrative recalls Nehemiah’s (the governor of Judah) and the Jewish people’s efforts—despite opposition from scoffers, skeptics, and downright enemies—to rebuild the walls of Jerusalem that were destroyed by foreign rulers in the 6th century. Working together, the story also shows how Nehemiah and ordinary Jews harnessed their collective faith in God to rebuild their hopes and dreams as the people of Yahweh. Because of this, the book presents a portrait of persons dedicating themselves “to the common good” so that they may have a vibrant and thriving future.

Similarly, it is my hope that when we travel together to Chicago, that I, along with the students and adult sponsors, will let the theme “Rebuilding the Walls” ring true in our lives as we seek to draw on our faith and help existing ministries rebuild the lives and dreams of the homeless in another city. Not only that, but I pray that by working together to reconstruct one aspect of Chicago’s “walls,” we will begin to see how God is calling and challenging us, both youth and adults, to rebuild our own walls, right here in Kansas City.

Hopefully, I have been **gracious**. One of the definitions for gracious given in the Merriam-Webster dictionary is Godly, pleasing and acceptable. One of the challenges of Intentional Interim Ministry is the "dual call" nature of the profession. ## Children and Families

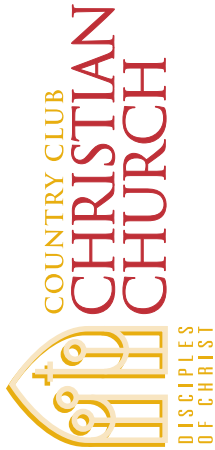
### The Gospel According to Dr. Seuss
