Do Not Be Afraid

by Dr. R. Glen Miles



Luke tells two stories of miraculous births at the beginning of his gospel. You've heard of Mary's story but do you know the one about Zechariah and Elizabeth? They are an older couple and childless. They are well beyond the age of bringing children in to the world. The angel comes to Zechariah to announce the birth. Zechariah doesn't believe it and loses his voice as a result.

The same angel comes to Mary. She has some questions for the angel. She is "perplexed."

The angel, sensing her worry, says "Do not be afraid." She is invited to face her fear but not allow it to control her. At the end of this heavenly encounter she announces, "Here am I, the servant of the Lord."

The old priest lost his voice but Mary found hers. Zechariah, an official representative of the Holy God of Israel, doesn't understand that God is at work. Mary, a young, powerless peasant girl from a little nothing of a town, when faced with a holy opportunity, simply says, "Yes."

Kathleen Norris writes about this. "(Mary) does not lose her voice but finds it...she asserts herself before God saying 'Here am I.'"

Norris says that she treasures this story because it forces her to ask, "When the mystery of God's love breaks through into my consciousness do I run from it? Do I ask of it what I cannot answer? Shrugging, do I retreat into facile clichés, popular false wisdom of what 'we all know'? Or am I virgin enough to respond from my deepest, truest self, and say something new, a 'yes' that will change me forever?"

Luke is a master storyteller and a brilliant theologian, too. During this time of waiting and preparing for the celebration of Christmas, he wants us to know that it is OK to acknowledge our fear, to face the realities of our worries in this world and these days. But maybe, when we finally cradle the child named love, the very son of God in our arms, our fear might become what someone has called "a holy fear, full of wonder, mystery and surprise."

January Collection Connection

Country Club Christian Church is sending a group to Nicaragua to provide medical and construction work to the poorest of the poor. This group will be leaving Feb. 20 and returning on Feb. 28.

As part of this trip, the group will be providing home health kits to local families. To provide the most basic of items we all take for granted for the most simple of everyday health issues. We are collecting the following items during January to take with us to Nicaragua: acetaminophen (Tylenol), ibuprofen (Advil), antacids (Tums), cough drops, antibiotic ointment (Neosporin), bandages, toothbrushes, adult vitamins, children's vitamins (no gummies - they melt), prenatal vitamins (no softgels - they melt). Our greatest needs are for prenatal vitamins (no softgels - they melt in the heat) and antibiotic ointment. These two items are among the most expensive items we take with us and are of great importance to the people we will be visiting.

Due to restrictions on what we are allowed to bring into Nicaragua, we will be purchasing soap and toothpaste in Nicaragua to include in each kit.

If you would like to donate any of the above items [Note: All expiration dates must be no earlier than March 2011], or cash to help with the purchase of items in Nicaragua, please place your items in the Parlor during the month of January.

Giving Birth to Something New

My hand rose and fell in gentle motion across his tiny 4-year-old spine. I sang my standard lullabies. His muscles began to soften, releasing the days energy. Almost asleep. All of a sudden, my toddler son raised his head off the pillow and turned his serious face to me and offered this revelation: "When the dinosaurs were on the earth the people were still in God's tummy." My eyes widened. How did he ever think of this? How could this little boy concoct this complex awareness of time and space? How could he arrive at this creative resolution to blend the science in his

dinosaur books with his budding faith in the Creator God?

Initially I marveled at how a child could craft a solution to the dilemmas posed by science and religion. And yet so many experts in religion and professors of science have settled for dismissing the truths offered by the other. But over the years I have come to appreciate Connor's childhood insight as a challenge to my own faith. I try to conjure up his image of a God who holds humankind inside the holy womb, waiting to give birth to us. I reimagine God as a presence that envelopes human life. I picture God as that creative process that allows us to evolve into new ways of living. Maybe God who gave birth to Jesus (the holy in the human) so long ago, can still bring the divine into human flesh today. Maybe God can still give birth to us.

As we move from the birth story in the holy manger on Dec. 25 to the new beginnings of a secular New Year beginning Jan. 1, each of us has a chance to ponder what aspect of our lives might be born anew. The lights of Christmas sometimes highlight the painful places in our lives: a fractured marriage, a strained sibling relationship, an addiction, a career crisis. But even those of us not in crisis are sometimes haunted by a longing for new life: finding a soul-mate, re-entering the spiritual journey, risking a deeper friendship, deepening a community service commitment, devoting oneself to a self-care practice. Pay attention. It is possible that some old dinosaur in your life is becoming extinct? And God is giving birth to someone still inside God's tummy.


Mother/Daughter Workshop
